Fire Report: Home Heating, home safety

*check furnace, clean flues to decrease carbon monoxide problems

*don't use extension cords with portable heaters

*Use Smart 911: this allows residents to provide additional information to assist the 9-1-1 call takers may need to assist in an emergency. Go to smart911.com for more information.

*Smoke detectors/carbon monoxide detectors – supplied by the Red Cross. If you need one call the Cincinnati Fire Department Division of Fire Prevention at (513) 357-7585.

Police (Off. Rice/Capt. Jones):

*Block Watch – Please email Officer Rice if you have one on your block. See the “Crime Statistics” report for his information.

*There will be more traffic enforcement to reduce and prevent the number of auto accidents in all neighborhoods.
