Kennedy Heights Community Council April 21, 2020

The meeting was brought to order by Kate Elliott and Sharifah Tafari at 7:30 PM, online via Google Meet.

Fire Station 8 (Lt. Ed W.): 1) Electrical fires December-March = 45,000 per year.

- 2) Smart 911: All are encouraged to enroll. It is a time saver for caller and a help to the firefighters in an emergency.
- 3) COVID-19: 15 cases in the area to date. To protect yourself it is recommended you: *wash your hands a lot. Wash them for 20 seconds with soap and water... *wash your hands before touching your "T-Zone" (eyes, nose, and mouth)...
- *Stay Home if you don't have to go out.
- 4) Questions: How to get speed bumps around Triangle Park to protect playing children from speeding drivers. The fire department does not recommend them. The speed of the trucks is slowed down significantly by the bumps thus causing a delay (up to 2 minutes) in how fast they are able to get to an emergency.

Budget Report (Sr. Carren): Revenue and Expenditures reviewed. Motion (Kate Elliott) to accept, 2nd (Steve Greiser) ayes 100% voice vote.

Cincinnati Preschool Promise (LaKeisa Ealy): This is a non-profit organization that allows families access to quality Pre School Education.

- 1) Applications being taken May 1 for 3 year olds based on financial guidelines.
- 2) Essential workers who need child care, go to the website: Cincy-Promise.org.
- 3) On the YouTube channel are "Promise Readers" volunteers reading to preschoolers.

Kennedy Ave Bridge Update (Brandon Lecrone): The bridge has now been demolished. The next step is the construction of the underground foundation. He will follow-up with transportation regarding detours. Traffic will be monitored once it increases. There are no issues currently due to traffic being minimal.

Parks/Green Spaces Committee Update:
