CELEBRATING A NATIONAL HERO: 1ST LT JOHN H. LEAHR MEMORIAL IS UNVEILED

crowd of more than 100 turned out to celebrate the incredible legacy of Kennedy Heights' own 1st Lieutenant John H. Leahr. After months of planning and fundraising, the Leahr Memorial was finally unveiled with great celebration on June 9th..

1st Lieutenant John. H. Leahr was a documented, original Tuskegee Airman, part of the legendary group of black pilots who protected bombers in the air from German attack during World War II. He began training in 1943, and served overseas during the war.

Present at the celebration was Herb Heilbrun, aged 97, a friend of Leahr's and a bomber who also served in World War II and received the invaluable protection of the Tuskegee Airmen.

TELLING THE KENNEDY HEIGHTS STORY

YONONTE INN, part 3 Contributed by Ernie Barbeau



he 50-room Inn at Davenant was opened on May 13, 1888, one year after the undeveloped property was purchased by Robert Allison (who owned many acres in KH) and two residents of Vaughn Street (now Valleyview), John M. Foster and Charles J. Green.

The Enquirer, in a column titled *In Society's Domain:*The Season of Pleasure in Various Places of a Personal and Gossipy Character From Various Locations, reported the following June 18:

A jolly party of young ladies and gentlemen from Avondale chaperoned by Mrs. George Duckworth and Mrs. Harvey Thomas rode out (by horse) to the Yononte Inn in Kennedy Heights. The evening was spent in dancing. The party consisted of Mrs. Duckworth and Mrs. Thomas, and Misses (six females listed) and Messers (ten men listed).

The above newspaper item is probably the first Enquirer item about the Inn. At least 150 articles and items were published by the Enquirer between 1888 and 1910 about the Inn's owners, managers, guests, parties, and events. Unless noted otherwise, the Enquirer is the primary source for this series about the Inn. It is important to note that I have not found any direct Inn records, which significantly limits our ability to fully appreciate the Inn's history.

The Inn's House Warming was held on June 23, a Saturday evening, five weeks after the Inn was opened. The Inn's company arranged for a special train to leave the Cincinnati Lebanon & Northern Railway station at Court Street and Broadway at 6:30 p.m. and "to leave the station at Kennedy" (Woodford near Robison) at 11:00 p.m. Dancing was held after 9:00 p.m.

In August of 1888, the Inn's "landlord" was quoted as saying "We are still giving our Saturday night hops" at the Inn "and we will not discontinue them as long as the people encourage us as they have. The Narrow Gauge trains are being held on until half past ten o'clock on the evenings of the hops now." The "Narrow Gauge trains" are probably referring to the C.L.&N. train noted above)
